I am thrilled to introduce Through the Staff's very first Annual Report since we became an officially recognized 501(c)3 non-profit in February of 2022. As the Executive Director, I am honored to share with you this celebration of the progress we have made toward our vision of accessible music education for all.

Through the Staff was founded on a profound commitment to collective care. We hold the steadfast belief that every child, regardless of who they are, where they come from, or their financial means, deserves the right to pursue a rewarding musical journey. In a society that systematically excludes individuals from the arts, we exist to challenge the status quo. Together, we are

creating a world where professional music ensembles mirror the vibrant diversity of America, no student falls behind in their music class due to lack of funds, and no child is discouraged from pursuing music because of their identity or circumstances. By cultivating mutually beneficial relationships between students and mentors, we are actively shaping the future sustainability of the music field.

Over the last three years, Through the Staff has grown from a humble group of college friends to a nationwide movement, a network of supporters making tangible impacts on the lives of over 350 students across 32 states. Our community of over 700 volunteer teachers has provided over \$500,000 worth of online lessons since 2020, an achievement that would have been unimaginable just a few decades ago. 2022 was a huge year for us: we were granted 501(c)3 non-profit status, secured funding from the Rainwater Innovation Grant, connected with teachers at the Texas Music Educators Association Convention with the support of our generous sponsors Carolyn Nussbaum and Bocal Majority, launched our most successful fundraising campaign to date, and distributed hundreds of dollars worth of essential music equipment directly to our students.

We are moved by and deeply grateful for our donors, supporters, and volunteers for making this all possible. Your generosity has enabled us to break barriers for so many brilliant and creative students across the country. We are excited to continue cultivating a love for music in our students for years to come—this is only the beginning of what we can make possible.







EDUCATION FUND

The cost of music education supplies can pile up just as fast as the cost of lessons, creating yet another financial barrier to music education. We help cover these hidden costs with our Education Fund by shipping requested high quality items directly to students or reimbursing purchases.

Funds from the 2021 Rainwater Innovation Grant, courtesy of the University of Texas Butler School of Music, were used to build our Education Fund Toolbox in 2022, a standing inventory of common, necessary, and high-quality materials. The Toolbox consists of \$2,800 worth of USB microphones, music stands, metronome, tuners, MIDI Keyboards, and phone tripod stands that we began distributing to our students at no cost whatsoever in 2023!
